Location & Parking	<p>Humber Bridge Car park, Ferriby Road, Hessle HU13 0LN GR: TA021259</p> <p>What3Words: hired.less.costs</p> <p>On entering the car park follow the 'O' signs and look out for the HALO banner.</p> <p>There is ample free parking which will not be marshalled.</p> <p>It is unlikely that there will be any café/refreshment facilities at this venue. Water will be provided for finishers and there will be a cake stall, organised by Charlotte Ward.</p>
Directions by road	<p>The Humber Bridge Car Park will be 'O' signed from Ferriby Road which is close to and easily accessed from: A63 (either from the east (Hull) or west (M62)); A164 (north); A15 (Humber Bridge & south). See the map on the last page of these Final Details for directions.</p> <p>N.B. Do not follow the brown signs to the Humber Bridge Country Park and Hessle Foreshore.</p>
Travel by Train	<p>The nearest station is Hessle. If any competitor is travelling by train to the event, please contact the Organiser for further advice and assistance.</p>
Entries	<p>Competitors are requested to pre-enter by e-mail to the Organiser, with the following details: Name, Club, Age Class, BO number, SI card number.</p> <p>COMPETITORS WISHING TO RUN THE JUNIOR COURSE (E) MUST PRE-ENTER BY E-MAIL TO THE ORGANISER.</p> <p>PRE-ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BEFORE 10PM ON THURSDAY 17TH OCTOBER.</p> <p>Unless advised otherwise, it will be assumed that competitors will run the course appropriate to their age class and a map will be reserved for them accordingly. Entry fees to be paid at Registration on the day.</p> <p>Hire of contactless SI cards may also be reserved with pre-entries.</p> <p>Entry on the day will be available (subject to map availability).</p>
Registration, enquiries & download	<p>This will be located on hard standing to the south of the new Visitor Centre (not yet open).</p> <p>Registration, Visitor Centre, Tourist Information and Toilets are all located in the area around Z on the map (last page of these details).</p> <p>Registration will open at 10.00 and close at 12.00</p> <p>You must report to Registration before your run to either enter on the day or pay entry fees if you have pre-entered by e-mail.</p> <p>Entry fees (pre-entry and EOD); £7 Adult, £3 Junior/Students.</p> <p>SI card hire £1, £3.00 for contactless SIAC. There are only a limited number of SIACs available, which may be reserved via E-mail to Organiser.</p> <p>There is a £40 charge for lost or damaged hired SI Cards, £80 for SIAC.</p>

Facilities Dogs	<p>Public Toilets are located in the parking area, to the north west of the Visitor Centre and west of the Tourist Information Centre. Area Z on the map.</p> <p>Dogs are allowed on leads in the car park.</p> <p>The Country Park is a popular venue for dog walking. Dog owners are advised not to allow their dog to enter any of the three ponds in the park following recent reports of blue-green algal contamination.</p>
Start	<p>There will be two Starts.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Start for courses A-D is approximately 900m from the car park. Competitors should follow the signs and red/white tapes from the car park. Competitors wishing to run Course E must report to Registration when they are ready to start. <p>There will be a punching Start for all SI cards.</p>
Timing	<p>The event will use the Sportident timing system and all SI cards can be used. SIAC will be available at this event.</p> <p>N.B. Start and Finish controls WILL NOT be SIAC enabled.</p>
Start times and procedure	<p>Starts will be from 10.30 to 12.30. Start times will not be allocated. Loose control descriptions and example maps will be available at the Start. Control Descriptions will be printed on the maps.</p> <p>Courses A-D will use the IOF Standard description format.</p> <p>Course E will use text descriptions.</p> <p>A punching start will be used by all competitors.</p>
Finish	<p>The Finish for senior courses (A-D) will be close to the Humber Bridge Car Park.</p> <p>All competitors must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Punch the Finish control as it will not be SIAC enabled. Report to download, even if they retire or do not complete the course. <p>All courses will close at 14.00 prompt.</p>
Controls	<p>SI control stations will be mounted, with a standard kite, on street furniture, lamp posts, telegraph posts, fences and on top of stakes, as appropriate to the location of the control. The control number will be marked on the control unit. Gripple wires will be used to secure the SI stations to the feature.</p>
Courses	<p>See table below for details.</p> <p>Please Note:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Men's Open competitors will run Course A with Women's Open and Men's Vet competitors. There will be only one Junior course, Course E. <p>Competitors under 16 years of age MUST be accompanied by an adult if they wish to enter Courses A-D. In order to be competitive in the event, Adults must complete their run before supervising an under-16 competitor on their course.</p> <p>It will not be possible to offer a String Course at this event.</p>
Map	<p>Senior Courses: (A-D) 1:5000. Original survey & cartography, Neil Harvatt (2018), extended by Peter Harris (2019). Contour interval 2.5m.</p> <p>Junior Course (E): 1:4000. Original survey, John Chaney, and cartography, Mike Smith (2006), update by Neil Harvatt (2017). Contour interval 2.5m.</p> <p>Maps (A3, Courses A-D; A4 Course E) will be printed on waterproof paper as far as possible. Where maps are not printed on waterproof paper, they will be bagged.</p> <p>N.B. Course A will have a double-sided map.</p>

	<p>Competitors must comply with the ISSOM forbidden crossing symbols for fences, walls, buildings and vegetation. Legends WILL NOT be printed on the map and will be available to view at Registration.</p>
Terrain	<p>Senior Courses (A-D):</p> <p>Typical, essentially flat, urban terrain around Hessle town centre and a newly mapped area to the west that links Hessle town centre to the Humber foreshore, Humber Bridge.</p> <p>Junior Course (E):</p> <p>These will use the Humber Bridge Country Park which is an old chalk quarry, essentially on two levels with some steep cliffs and slopes. The park is now quite mature with areas of vegetation and woodland, some with contour detail, and grassed open areas. There are numerous tracks and paths and runnability is generally good. Numerous sets of steps are available on paths and tracks that join one level to another and to the quarry top, car park area.</p>
Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Competitors take part at their own risk and are responsible for their own safety. • Competitors are recommended to carry a whistle. • Car keys may be left at Registration/Download, if necessary. Competitors travelling alone should leave their car keys and particulars at Registration. • Please be courteous to pedestrians and take care when turning blind corners, around buildings, in narrow alleyways and crowded areas. Be aware that some surfaces will be slippery when wet. • Courses A to D, will cross busy roads as well very quiet residential streets. It is your responsibility to cross them carefully, giving way to all vehicles and cyclists. • Courses A to D will pass through the central 'Hessle Square' area and streets and alleyways in the immediate vicinity. These are likely to be very busy with a number of pedestrians and cars passing through with some seeking and leaving parking spaces. • All competitors must report to Download, even if they do not complete their course. • First Aid will be available from Registration/Download. The nearest A&E is at Hull Royal Infirmary, HU3 2JZ (~6.5 miles / ~12min.drive from Hessle). Details will be available from Registration.

Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Junior course will be entirely in the Humber Bridge Country Park. • Leg covering is recommended. • Competitors should be aware of the sheer cliffs (impassable) and very steep slopes which are marked on the map. In wet weather, the numerous steps and chalk rock in particular, are slippery, as are the soil covered, steep slopes. • There are three ponds in the park. At this time of year, they may have a significant amount of water in them. They will be clearly marked on the map, though their extent will vary depending on recent rainfall. Do not attempt to enter or cross them. • The park is very popular with walkers (& runners), families, dog walkers and cyclists. Please be alert to other users and exercise due care and consideration at all times whilst running.


Directions &

Free Parking

From the west (M62 - A63).
Take slip road **(B)** for Humber Bridge. At roundabout take 4th exit (1st after dual carriageway) on to Ferriby Road **(C)** on map)

Turn right into HB CP at **X**

From the north (A164 Humber Bridge). At ("Humber Bridge") roundabout **(E)** take 3rd exit (turn right) on to Boothferry Road and carry straight on at the lights. At the roundabout take 1st Exit (slow - it is almost a hairpin!) **(C)** on map.



From the east (Hull - A63).
Pass under the Humber Bridge and take next slip road **(D)** for Humber Bridge. At the T junction turn left. Pass over the A63 to roundabout and take 4th exit (1st after dual carriageway) on to Ferriby Road **(C)** on map)
Turn right into HB CP at **X** **(O)** signed)

From the south A15 Humber Bridge (Toll £1.50).

Use left-most Toll Booth, keep left and take first left turn at **A** on map. Turn left at the T junction into the CP
