Dot. Dash Dash. Dot.....

David Jolly recently tried Radio-Orienteering. Here is his report....

Since HALO were not running at the Compass Sport Trophy final in Devon, I seized upon the opportunity for my first dalliance with a different type of orienteering, ARDF (amateur radio direction finding) and headed off to Leicestershire.

The format of Radio-O is similar to that of a score event, but the controls are not marked on the map. Instead a radio transmitter at each location sends out a unique identifying signal. Using a handheld receiver it's possible to determine the direction of the strongest signal (DF) and follow that until you've located the control, whereupon there's a familiar looking kite and SI box. However the transmitters only send out their identifying signal for 1 minute, every five minutes.

I'm given a 'blank' orienteering map of the area, a clipboard, a radio receiver with headphones, and a pen to draw bearings. They recommend spare headphones and a spare battery for obvious reasons but thankfully I don't know this beforehand. There are 5 'controls' to find and a time limit of 2 hours.

I'm first off and the road route to get round the OOB houses and into the woods gives me some listening time. All the controls sound like they are in the same direction and I head confidently into the woods. Confidence that soon dwindles when I emerge from the other side of the woods, having lost contact with the map and no directions determined. Realising that this isn't going to be a quick game I plough on with not much idea how I'm going to unravel this mess. Hopefully something will materialise.

Fortunately it does, control number 1 is suddenly behind me. I take a gamble and head into the woods on a bearing taken from the signal. Only at the next transmission can I home in, it sounds loud, first one punched!

As I head off towards #2 I know I can't make it but, the 4 minutes of silent time gives me chance to think what to do next. A lightbulb moment when I realise that a zig zag approach will help me confirm the bearing. After finding #2 I'm starting to get more confident and manage to go on and find controls 3, 4 and 5. Is there a finish beacon? The answer is no, just a finish punch back at the start. Completed in less than an hour. Good result and I am still astounded at how the mess and confusion cleared as the course progressed. Great fun and a good lesson in "DON'T PANIC."
